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1 Presentation 2

The presentation 2 consists of two part: (1) writing a draft (graded as a group) and (2) group presentation (graded individually; that is, members in the same group may receive different grades).

Objective:

Prepare and deliver a group presentation in Japanese, demonstrating your understanding and application of the grammar and vocabulary studied in Chapters 1-5 of the "Genki" textbook. Focus on using verbs, adjectives, numbers, and demonstratives.

The presentation should be a dialogue between/among two or three friends, but all other parameters are up to your creativity. Maybe the dialogue is among students taking the Japanese language class at LaGuardia Community College. Maybe, the dialogue is taking place in Tokyo, Japan. Please use your creative mind to decide the backgrounds of your presentation.

Group Formation:

The ideal number of the presentation group is two. If you want, you can make a group of three.

Content Requirements:

(1) Opening

- Choose a common topic (e.g., daily routines, travel experiences, food preferences)
- If necessary, introduce the background of the conversation (e.g., who you are, where the conversation is taking place, when it is etc.) in English.

(2) Introduction:

- Each member should introduce themselves using self-introduction phrases.
- Include name, year in school, major, age, and hobbies etc.

(3) Main Body. The main body of the presentation must have ALL of the following elements:

- Use various verbs in different tenses (present, past, affirmative, negative; See Chapters 3 and 5).
- Include adjectives to describe experiences or objects (see Chapter 4).
- Utilize demonstratives (これ、それ、あれ、どれ) appropriately (see Chapter 2).
- Incorporate numbers (e.g., 1,000 円)
- Use particles (e.g., を, に, で, へ) with verbs (See Chapter 3).

(4) Conclusion:

- Your presentation should always end with a proper greeting for farewell (i.e., 「さようなら」 or 「じゃあ、また」)

Language Use:

- Use a variety of sentence structures learned. It's not easy to use new grammatical structures and vocabulary that you didn't practice in class for your presentation.
- Ensure everyone speaks an equal amount of Japanese.
- Correctly use particles and sentence-ending forms like "です" and "ます."

Presentation Details:

- Duration: 3 minutes or longer per group.
- Visual aids: Use slides, props, or images to enhance your presentation.

Assessment Criteria:

- Fluency and accuracy in Japanese.
- Use of grammar and vocabulary from Chapters 1-5.
- Creativity and engagement of the presentation.
